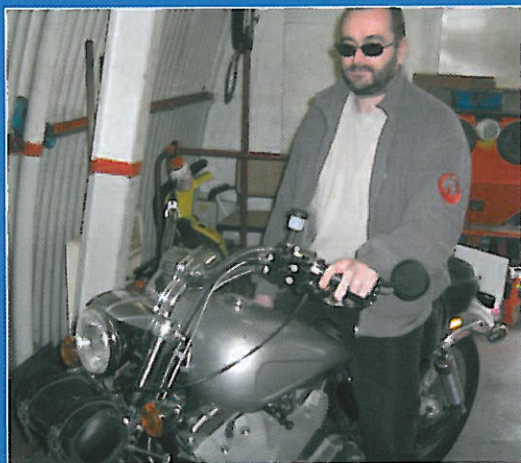


Stuart Hollyhead's Harley Davidson 883R

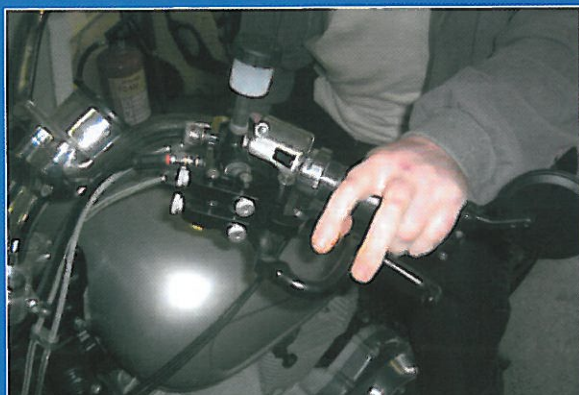
Despite the severity of his problems Stuart was determined to get back to biking as soon as possible. After taking advice from the NABD he went to Cambridge Motorcycles (01223 360176) to arrange for the adaption work to be carried out.



The adaptations include a Neptune twin lever (now produced as the West Twin Lever, www.pfmbrakes.com), a hydraulic clutch conversion, forward-control and footboard conversion, a steering damper, modification to the handlebar switches

& wiring and a larger fuel tank to avoid having to fill-up so often.
